SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

OAHS ASB President, Kaitlin Tilley reported on the current events at the high school. Planning is underway for a Sadie Hawkins Dance in February. The upcoming Winter Sports Rally will have a circus theme and should be very enjoyable. OAHS has partnered with Righetti High School to form a Cinderella's Closet Club. High school recruiting sessions will be held on January 10th at Lakeview Jr. High and January 25th at Orcutt Jr. High

Mr. Dana reported that the Independent Study K-8 has a current enrollment of 66 students. The Independent Study Program lets parents choose either home study or a blended program that includes classroom instruction. The program is currently housed in three classrooms on the Alice Shaw School campus. Because Alice Shaw's enrollment has expanded and is in need of additional space for student services, the school will need to reclaim the Independent Study classrooms for the 2013-2014 school year. Marysia and Joe have been researching potential sites for the program and have identified a prospective site at First Christian Church, located at the intersection of Battles Road and College Drive. The new site includes three classrooms with access to restrooms, nearby parking, outdoor tables and playground and possibly a small office space. This would provide a safe and quiet environment for the students. Possible negatives could be the lack of a library or computer lab, limited special education services and a less convenient location for the Orcutt community students. Mr. Lyon reported that the 2nd semester at OAHS was off to a good start regardless of the "Senior Prank". There was discussion with the Board regarding sports league placement.
