BACKGROUND:

Educational Code Section 42100 states that "on or before September 15, the governing board of each school district shall approve on a form prescribed by the Superintendent of Public Instruction, an annual statement of all receipts and expenditures of the district for the preceding fiscal year and shall file the statement with the County Superintendent of Schools."

In keeping with that provision, the Orcutt Union School District is providing the final unaudited actual revenues and expenditures for the 2014-15 year.

With the exception of the beginning balance and reserves, the 2015-16 budget remains unchanged from that adopted on June 10, 2015. Changes in the estimated fund balances due to the 2014-15 actuals are incorporated into the beginning balances for 2015-16 for the Charter Fund.

The state requires that the Board of Trustees certify that they have reviewed the Unaudited Actuals Financial Report for the district at a Board meeting.
